# ROLE OF MILITARY FORCES IN HLS

1. Civilian Primacy
2. Civilian Responsibility
3. Military forces in support
  - Unique Capabilities (e.g., EOD, CBRN, Transport)
  - Large numbers of Disciplined Forces
4. As a Last Resort- Military can be in control...  
but only as long as it takes the Civil Authority  
to regain control

# INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION

1. Centralized, Joint Planning with Civil Authorities
2. Exercise the Plan
  - Tactically, Operationally, Strategically
3. Liaison across multiple sectors of government
4. Stress interoperability
  - In equipment as possible
  - In procedures (Improved, Mutual Understanding)
5. Cooperation with Law Enforcement
  - In Extremis; Always in Support; Soldiers are not Policemen
