Biography

Barre R. Seguin became the director of the George C. Marshall European Center for Security Studies in June 2021. He is responsible for orchestrating resident courses, outreach programs, language training, and an international and interagency alumni network in fields of international security studies, defense, and foreign affairs.

Seguin retired from the U.S. Air Force in October 2020 as a major general after nearly 32 years of active service. His last assignment while on active duty was as the deputy chief of staff, Strategic Employment, Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe, in Mons, Belgium.

Seguin held a variety of flying, command, and staff assignments including commands at the squadron, group, wing, and Air and Space Expeditionary Task Force levels.

Seguin is a veteran of Operations Deliberate Guard, Deliberate Forge, Joint Guardian, Southern Watch, Inherent Resolve, Resolute Support, and Freedom's Sentinel.
