

*per Concordiam* usually accepts articles from contributors as original contributions. If another version of the article is under consideration by another publication, or has been published elsewhere, authors should clearly indicate this at the time of submission. If you have a manuscript that you would like to submit to *per Concordiam*, but you are not sure if it's "right" for the quarterly, email us at [Editor@perconcordiam.org](mailto:Editor@perconcordiam.org) to ask whether we are interested.

Before submitting an article or manuscript send us an outline or blurb, not a finished article. You'll hear back from us much faster. And if we like the idea, we can offer feedback before you get started.

- *Avoid the obvious.* Topics that are covered heavily in other security and foreign policy journals will not be published unless they offer a unique, bottom-up approach, from the region.
- *Connect the dots.* *per Concordiam* will run articles on single countries, but those articles must explain 'why' what is occurring in country 'X' is relevant to the rest of the region or the world.
- *Do not assume a US audience.* The readership of *per Concordiam* consists of readers from Europe and Eurasia. Articles that pander to a US audience will likely not be published; the mission of *per Concordiam* is to generate candid discussion of relevant security and defense topics – it is not to serve as an echo chamber for US foreign policy.
- *Steer clear of technical language.* Not everyone is a specialist in a certain field; the ideas captured in articles should be accessible to the widest possible audience.
- *Provide original research or reporting to support your ideas.* And be prepared to document what you say. *per Concordiam* fact-checks everything we publish. Pitch articles for specific departments.

Please bear in mind that it's impossible to evaluate manuscripts that we haven't seen, but we can tell you whether, for example, we have just accepted another article on the same topic. We can also assess whether the topic is suitable for *per Concordiam* and whether the editors might have a particular interest in considering your paper. Authors are requested to give a brief biographical note in a footnote on the first page of the paper and provide a digital photo (at least 300 dpi resolution) for inclusion on the Contributor's Page of the magazine. Submissions must be accompanied by a cover email containing contact information: postal address, telephone and fax numbers (if available), and e-mail address for each author (if the paper is co-authored). In this case one of the authors should be designated as the "corresponding author.
