Resident Programs

PROGRAM ON APPLIED SECURITY STUDIES (PASS)

PASS is a graduate-level program in international security studies designed for early- to mid-career security practitioners from governments around the globe, including civilian government officials, military and security service members, and government academics.

PROGRAM ON CYBER SECURITY STUDIES (PCSS)

PCSS is a comprehensive policy-focused, non-technical cyber security program that explores the increasing domestic, international and transnational challenges in cyber security. The program is tailored for senior officials responsible for developing or influencing cyber legislation, policies or practices.

SEMINAR IN IRREGULAR WARFARE/HYBRID THREATS (SIWHT)

SIWHT assists practitioners to examine the actions adversarial states employ in the Grey Zone below the threshold of direct military conflict to undermine the national security of democratic states. The seminar analyzes a range of tactics including coercive economics, the use of proxy forces, cyberwarfare, disinformation operations, and "lawfare."

6 - 23 FEBRUARY 2024

PROGRAM ON COUNTERING TRANSNATIONAL ORGANIZED CRIME (CTOC)

CTOC focuses on the national security threats posed by transnational criminal organizations. The course is designed for government officials and practitioners who are engaged in strategy and policy formulation.

27 FEBRUARY - 21 MARCH 2024

PROGRAM ON REGIONAL SECURITY STUDIES (PRSS)

PRSS is an in-resident program in international security studies which is an essential part of the MISS program. This five-week course analyzes the parameters of regional security within Europe and its flanks in the context of renewed strategic competition. It examines the strategic objectives and instruments of statecraft of global and regional revisionist powers, with an emphasis on ways hybrid and irregular warfare methods challenge the rules-based order and Euro-Atlantic values and contribute to conflicts and instability. The PRSS brings together mid- and senior-level officials and practitioners.

9 APRIL - 9 MAY 2024

PROGRAM ON COUNTERING TRANSNATIONAL ORGANIZED CRIME, INTERNATIONAL FORUM (CTOC-IF)

CTOC-IF is a three-day senior-leader forum that creates an opportunity for law enforcement executives at the principal and deputy level, along with their counterpart policy experts, to examine the most critical challenges in combating transnational organized crime.

29 APRIL - 3 MAY 2024

PROGRAM ON TERRORISM AND SECURITY STUDIES (PTSS)

PTSS creates and empowers a global network of counterterrorism professionals in the fight against transnational terrorism and violent extremist organizations. Participants examine terrorist actions and capabilities while discussing, sharing and providing best practices for comprehensive whole-of-government and whole-of-society solutions.

4 - 27 JUNE 2024

SENIOR EXECUTIVE SEMINAR (SES)

SES is an annual seminar tailored to meet the needs of national ministers, ambassadors, legislators, admirals, general officers and other senior government officials. The topic of SES changes with each iteration of the course in order to focus on the most critical and relevant contemporary security issues.

13 - 17 MAY 2024

SEMINAR ON RUSSIA

The seminar on Russia provides a deeper analytical understanding of Russia, the ways and means it employs, and how democratic states can compete and win. The course covers Russian political, economic, military, informational, and hybrid approaches, the impact on the region and the world, and strategies and actions states can take to counter Russia. The course focuses on the impact of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, and provides contemporary analysis and case studies to highlight both successful and unsuccessful scenarios in countering Russian aggression.

9 - 19 JULY 2024

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENHANCEMENT COURSE (ELEC)

ELEC is available to participants registered to attend select in-resident programs. ELEC provides customized language and language skills development to prepare participants for the linguistic demands of their follow-on GCMC programs.

Other Programs

MASTER OF ARTS PROGRAM IN INTERNATIONAL SECURITY STUDIES (MISS)

MISS is a postgraduate program for mid-level security professionals offered jointly by the Universität der Bundeswehr München (UniBw) and the Marshall Center. The program is designed to prepare international military and civilian students who already have years of professional experience for executive positions in the public and private sector.

OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Outreach activities are offered throughout the year to address critical security and defense issues to the widest possible audiences. Events are held within partner nations, and respond to the needs of stakeholders with tailored events.



EURASIAN FOREIGN AREA OFFICER (FAO) PROGRAM

The FAO Training Program prepares U.S. military officers to be leading regional experts, or “Soldier-Statesmen,” and to serve in key political-military assignments throughout Eurasia.

RUSSIAN WAY OF WAR (RWOW)

RWOW is a program specifically built for Foreign Area Officers to gather and learn the most up-to-date information on Russia at the operational and tactical level. The course is part of the Eurasian Foreign Area Officer training program.

EURASIAN SECURITY STUDIES SEMINAR (ES3)

ES3 is a region-specific orientation course for new Foreign Area Officers focusing on Europe/Eurasia. It is designed to expose new FAOs to strategic thinking and to give an overview of the key topics affecting the security environment. ES3 also includes a week-long field study consisting of engagements at U.S. European Command, U.S. Army Europe, the Defense Threat Reduction Agency, NATO HQ, and SHAPE.

FELLOWS PROGRAM

The U.S. Senior Fellows Program provides a regionally focused, professional education experience for officers from the U.S. Air Force and U.S. Army. The program is comprised of three subordinate fellows programs, each of which are selected by their agencies: the U.S. Army War College, the U.S. Air War College and the Army’s G-3/5/7 fellows are selected at the rank of lieutenant colonel and colonel, while the G-3/5/7 fellows are usually Majors or Lieutenant Colonels.

THE PARTNER LANGUAGE TRAINING CENTER EUROPE (PLTCE)

The Partner Language Training Center Europe (PLTCE) provides flexible language training for U.S. linguists while offering English and strategic language instruction and expertise for NATO allies and worldwide partners. As a NATO Partnership Training and Education Centre (PTEC) and a NATO accredited Education & Training Facility, PLTCE advocates linking with and sharing expertise with NATO and partner nation language specialists. The PLTCE faculty and staff have a proven track record of serving a variety of needs of the U.S. Department of Defense and NATO.

ALUMNI PROGRAMS

Alumni programs offer tools to keep alumni engaged, informed, and involved in the network. The members-only alumni website GlobalNET (<https://members.marshallcenter.org>) provides access to course materials and offers free access to numerous research databases, and contact information for all alumni in the network.

Alumni Scholars Program: This is a competitive program to conduct in-residence research at the Marshall Center. The scholarships are available to all alumni, regardless of work status. The program includes a fully-funded five weeks in-residence to do research on a security topic.

Outreach Networking Event (ONE): ONEs are held approximately 30 times per year in capital cities across Europe and Eurasia. ONEs bring together local alumni, staff and faculty of the Marshall Center, as well as U.S. and Germany Embassies. All alumni, regardless of their service country, are welcome to attend these events.

Regional Alumni Forums: Regional Forums bring alumni from select geographic regions together to discuss relevant topics. Alumni participants are competitively selected by the Alumni Programs Department. Applications are solicited directly from individual alumni unless directed otherwise by embassies.

SOUTHEAST EUROPE FORUM (SEEF)

SEEF focuses on regional security issues within Southeast Europe as an anchor for regional engagement. It places particular emphasis on specific topics related to strategic competition and the role of external actors, hybrid and irregular challenges, and Euro Atlantic integration and cooperation.
